






#### **ABOUT US**

Established in 2019 on the initiative of FILLEA (the Italian federation of wood, building and allied workers), under article 1 of its bylaws, the Nuove Ri-Generazioni Association is intended "to promote the culture of a new urban development model based on regenerating the built environment of neighborhoods and cities, and therefore the social networks within them, by promoting construction and a building material supply chain that are environmentally sustainable and socially aware, and involve all the relevant economic, civic and institutional players".



SPI, the trade union for CGIL retirees, has become a member of Nuove Ri-Generazioni, helping to define its work objectives by expanding its range of action across the country and in individual neighborhoods.

The association aims to provide scientific, processing, awareness-building, research and technical discussion support to the FILLEA, SPI and local CGIL branches in their trade union, dispute resolution and local collective bargaining activities. To this end, we are setting up a national structure and local offices of Nuove Ri-Generazioni have already been set up in Umbria, Rome and Lazio, Liguria and Campania.

The association is a member of ASVIS (Italian alliance for sustainable development) and the Riabitare l'Italia network, which deals with the issues surrounding remote areas and demographic decline. We work with many other associations, including Legambiente, Forum Diseguaglianze e Diversità, Kyoto Club, Green Italia.

#### THE VISION

Nuove Ri-Generazioni is intended as a place to conduct research and make proposals on issues related to sustainable development and green building. A forum for discussion and debate to help develop a culture of sustainability by offering tools for interpretation and in-depth analysis, encouraging policies to promote green building, urban regeneration, the recovery of urban suburbs, supporting local action and dispute resolution to start pilot projects, from the most degraded large urban areas to the internal areas of the country.

Long-standing needs intertwine with new ones in local areas, in the places where people live, in urban neighborhoods as well as in remote areas. We want to connect these places by developing new practices that affirm rights and respond to needs. Making the places where we live the centers of a new shared well-being.

## THE PLACES, THE PEOPLE INVOLVED

Launching sustainable development policies without addressing the issue of urban and remote area regeneration is unthinkable. Urban areas and remote areas (both people and the land) are the places where the 2030 goals must be pursued and achieved. It is unimaginable to think of stable and sustainable economic growth without a reform of the public and private building sector that is focused on redevelopment, reuse and the new needs of society.

For these reasons, the Association intends to support action by the trade unions to provide scientific assistance and knowledge but also information and participatory campaigns to help local organizations and trade union centers in every way.

In short, urban and social regeneration go hand-in-hand: our task is to make that happen.
